WHAT THEY DO



LEAD COLLABORATE VOLUNTEER

University students spend 8 hours a week in TYO early childhood and youth enrichment classes as teachers' aids and translators.

Volunteers work closely with international interns to build curricula and implement activities to meet local needs and culture.

Standout university volunteers are selected to form a Youth Leadership Committee (YLC). After receiving additional training, YLC members apply their new skills as mentors for peers implementing youth-designed civic projects.

BUILDING INDIVIDUALS

SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Volunteers receive training in classroom management, working with and mentoring children with psychosocial needs, professional conduct, leadership, and public speaking.

INTERCULTURAL EXCHANGE

Through their close collaboration with international interns, volunteers gain unique cross-cultural dialogue opportunities and practical English language skills.
